Grand Majestic Eagles Club (GMEC) is a Filipino socio-civic and fraternal organization based in **Doha, State of Qatar**, affiliated with **The Fraternal Order of Eagles - Philippine Eagles, Inc. (TFOE-PE)** and belonging to **Saudi Arabia Eagles Eastern Region III (SAEER-III)**.

GMEC was formally chartered on **April 12, 2025**, at the **Holiday Villa Hotel in Doha**, with **36 founding members composed of 27 male and 9 female members**.

Its chartering was personally led by TFOE-PE National President **Eagle Ronald Delos Santos** and was publicly reported as a historic first for the Eagles movement in Qatar.

A Historic Chartering in Qatar

Grand Majestic Eagles Club was formally chartered at **Holiday Villa Hotel in Doha, Qatar**, with:

36 Founding Members

27 Male • 9 Female

The ceremony was personally led by **TFOE-PE National President Eagle Ronald Delos Santos**.

The published account of the event described the occasion as a historic milestone for the Eagles movement in Qatar.

Among the personalities identified during the chartering were:

- **Eagle Ronald Delos Santos** — TFOE-PE National President
- **Eagle Dande Serot** — Governor, SAEER-III
- **Hon. Cassandra Sawadjaan** — First Secretary and Consul General, Philippine Embassy in Qatar
- **Eagle Edgar Clamonte** — President, Silangang Bagani Eagles Club
- **Eagle Raymond Cabauatan** — President, Grand Majestic Eagles Club
- **Eagle Jeroam James Arriesgado** — Vice President, Grand Majestic Eagles Club

The ceremony included the **Qatar National Anthem, Philippine National Anthem, Eagles Hymn, oath-taking of members, and formal chartering rites**.

The event brought together TFOE-PE leaders, Philippine Embassy representatives, Filipino community leaders, diplomats, and Eagles representatives from across the Gulf region.

August 8, 2025

Growth Through the Eras Nobles Batch

Only four months after chartering, GMEC welcomed its next major group of members through the induction of the **Eras Nobles Batch**.

The growth strengthened GMEC's capacity to conduct socio-civic programs and prepared the organization for the next stage of its development.

December 5, 2025

From One Club to a Growing Family

One of GMEC's most significant milestones came less than eight months after its own chartering.

GMEC sponsored the formation of **four new Eagles clubs**:

Grand Majestic Lady Eagles Club 1

17 female members

Grand Majestic Lady Eagles Club 2

15 members

Majestic Conclave Eagles Club

25 members

Majestic Auto Eagles Club

25 members

All four clubs were officially chartered on **December 5, 2025**, by TFOE-PE National President **Eagle Ronald Delos Santos**.

Together, the four newly chartered clubs represented:

82 MEMBERS

As part of the expansion, some GMEC members were distributed among the newly established clubs to strengthen their organizational foundations.

Following this restructuring:

GMEC CONTINUED WITH 29 MEMBERS

The change in GMEC membership therefore formed part of a broader organizational expansion rather than simply a reduction in membership.

Becoming an Eagle follows a structured process:

1. Interview

Finding a sponsor, submitting a Letter of Intent, and undergoing the membership interview.

2. Introduction

Formal introduction to the organization and participation in initial activities.

3. Indoctrination

Learning Eagleism, Eagles traditions, solemnities, Prayer, Pledge, and Hymn.

4. Incubation

Participation in General Membership Meetings, socio-civic activities, team-building, fellowship, and development programs.

5. Induction

Completion of requirements and taking the formal Oath of Membership.

The orientation indicates an approximate development period of **three to four months**.
